

The Eucharistic miracle of Bolsena is belived to be occurred consacration in 1263 in the town of the same name: while a priest was celebrating mass, at the moment of the consecration the host bled.

The visit to the catacombs offers a journey to the roots of our faith, to the roots of the Christian community of Bolsena. The itinerary begins in front of the altar of the Eucharistic Miracle, then passing through the centuries, next to the sarcophagus of S. Cristina in the crypt.







Lake Bolsena is located in northern Lazio in the province of Viterbo at a height of 305 meters above sea level. It is the largest volcanic lake in Europe and in Lazio and the fifth largest lake in Italy with an area of 113.5 sq km.

The main caldera, which has taken on the characteristic elliptical shape typical of lakes of volcanic origin, is set in the mountainoushilly group of Monti Volsini.




## **ST. PATRICK'S WELL**
